

There is nothing more rewarding than to offer your time and energy to give respect and compassion to so many that





Rotary Club Works to Protect the Wekiva River

ne of Florida's most naturally beautiful resources is in peril. The water quality and scenic beauty of the Wekiva River is decreasing at an increasing rate. Polluting chemicals and septic tank seepage continually flow into the Wekiva River Basin daily. Silt and sand from construction projects within the basin boundaries are filling in natural deep spots and make the water flow wider and shallower. Native and non-native vegetation clog established flow patterns and can change the course of the water flow.

As a community service project, The Rotary Club of Seminole County South, with the assistance of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, created the "Wekiva River Promise." Our goal is to increase public awareness of the Wekiva River Basin and encourage participation in ways to protect the region's ecology.

Donations received from magazine distribution and sponsorship of the Promise will be used to cover costs incurred from production of the magazine about the Basin, for Basin improvement projects, and an educational project for the local schools.

To date, many people offered their time and services to help with this

major Rotary Service Project. Committees have been formed to assist in the production and distribution of Promise materials, and we hope to be able to leverage the greatly varied talents of those who want to contribute their time.

he Rotary Club of Seminole County South is part of Rotary International. There are 34,282 clubs and over 1.2 million members worldwide. Our club has been active in local community charities since our beginning in 1969.

Our Club has been contributing funds to AIR and a number of our members traveled to Guatemala to plant trees, build stoves, and help with the activities of AIR.

The Alliance for International Reforestation, Inc. (AIR), is a non-profit organization that works to make a difference for the people of Guatemala and Nicaragua. AIR plants trees, establishes tree nurseries, provides environmental education for teachers and farmers, digs wells, builds fuel-efficient brick ovens, and helps to educate everyone about the environmental challenges facing Central America.

Since 1993, AIR has trained over 2,000 farmers, constructed over 750 fuel-efficient stoves, provided 18 high school scholarships to rural teenagers, established hundreds of tree nurseries, and planted over 3.8 million trees! In June 2011, US volunteers joined
