

Food Trucks/Trailers

1. All of your food trucks will need to have a gas inspection and hood suppression inspection completed by one of the following Seminole County municipalities. City of Altamonte Springs, City of Sanford, City of Longwood, City of Lake Mary or Seminole County. In most cases, when done within regular business hours the inspections are free of charge and take only 10-20 minutes to complete.
2. The food truck operator will need to complete the emergency response procedural training each year. The annual training is offered at various time lengths and does require a fee to complete. Fees vary.

Once everything has been completed, the inspector will notify us that the vendor has satisfied these requirements and are approved to operate within our venue.

Food trucks must also supply us with a certificate of insurance (COI) and a copy of their business license.

The City of Altamonte Springs needs to be listed as the certificate holder on all COIs.
